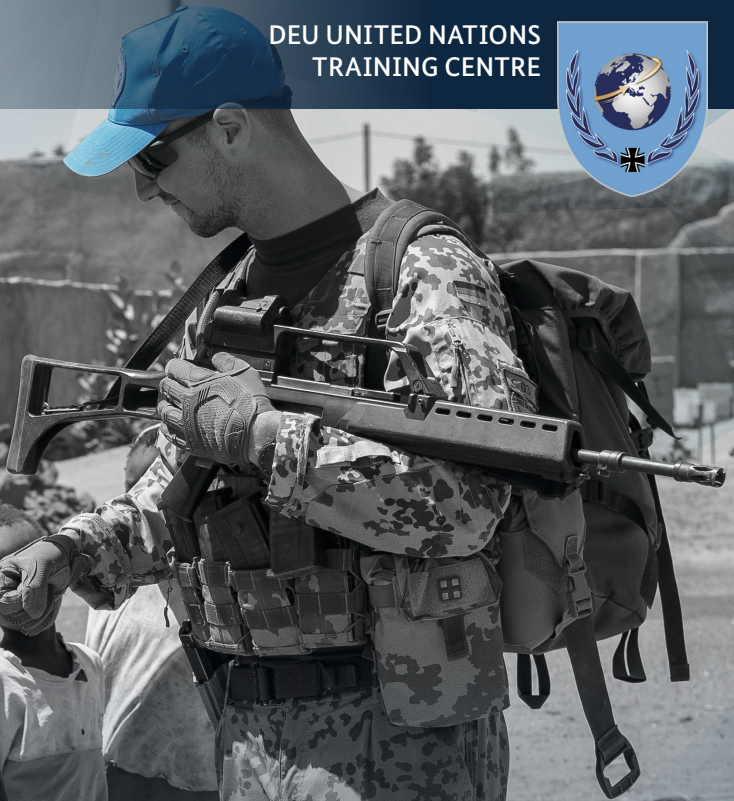

INTRODUCTION

WELCOME TO THE DEU UNTC

Germany has meanwhile been a member of the UN for over 50 years. The first German participation in a United Nations peacekeeping mission started in October 1991 in Cambodia (UNAMIC). Subsequently the German Armed Forces United Nations Training Centre (DEU UNTC) was founded in 1999 in Hammelburg/Bavaria. The mission of our multinational and interdepartmental training facility is to prepare military and civilian personnel for deployment into missions all around the world, and more recently as United Nations Military Observers.

Currently more than 97,000 UN uniformed personnel coming from over 120 countries and about 14,000 civilians serve in UN peacekeeping operations around the world. Modern peacekeeping operations are often very complex, and place high demands on those men and women which are deployed. As peacekeeping operations have become more multi-dimensional, the needs for high level pre-deployment training are increasing.

Based on our many years of experience in UN missions, it is important to us to create a realistic and operational environment where the course participants interact with professional military role players in real life scenarios.

Our center is committed to provide qua-

lity education using modern management processes and procedures to achieve excellence in all aspects of training. We understand quality as a continuous process. Therefore, we regularly adapt our courses to the evolving needs and requirements of various cooperation partners.

Through our membership of the International Network of Training facilities and our cooperation with national and international partners, we are in constant exchange of knowledge and experience. Our Instructor Exchange Program is key to sharing this knowledge and learning from each other.

The DEU UNTC is committed to continuous quality assurance and improvement and has been a NATO-accredited training institution since 2017. 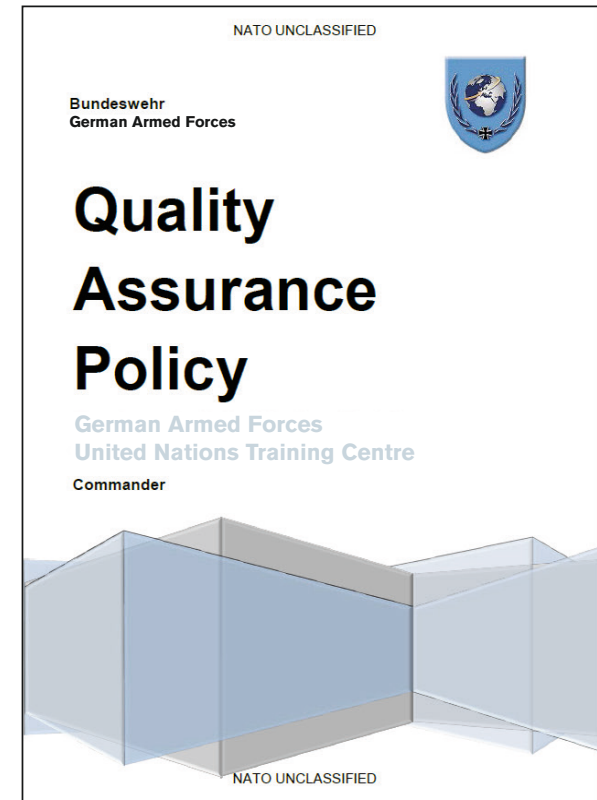

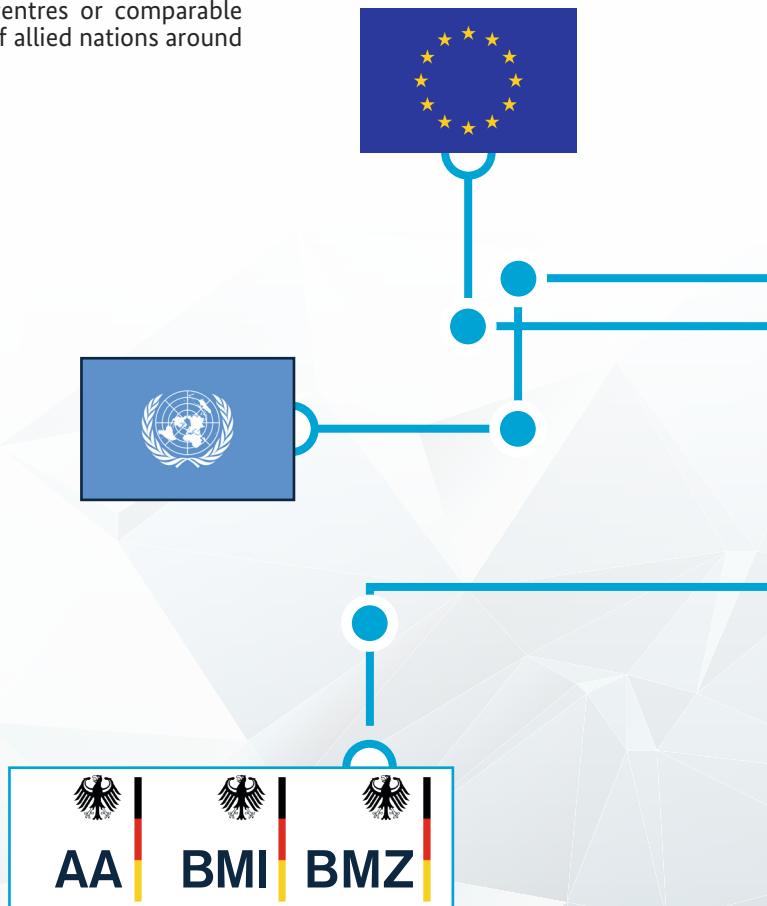


QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM
