WELCOME TO THE DEU UNTC

Germany has been a member of the United Nations (UN) for over 50 years by now. Its first involvement in a UN peacekeeping mission was in October 1991 in Cambodia (UNAMIC).

In 1999, the Bundeswehr United Nations Training Centre (DEU UNTC) was established in Hammelburg/Bavaria. The mission of the centre is to conduct multinational and interagency training for military and civilian personnel to prepare them for their deployments all over the world, and more recently, for missions as United Nations Military Observers.

Currently, more than 97,000 uniformed personnel from over 120 countries and approximately 14,000 civilians serve in UN peacekeeping operations around the world. More often than not, modern peacekeeping operations are very complex and place high demands on the personnel deployed on operations. As the nature of peacekeeping operations has become increasingly multidimensional, there is a growing need for high-quality pre-deployment training.

Our longstanding experience in UN missions is the basis for our ambition to create a realistic operational environment in which the course participants interact with professional military role players in real-life scenarios.

Our centre is committed to providing high-quality education and training using modern management processes and

procedures to achieve excellence in all aspects of training. We understand quality assurance as a continuous process. Therefore, we regularly adapt our course contents and structures to the evolving needs and requirements of various cooperation partners.

We are cooperating with national and international partners as part of an international network of education and training facilities, which provides for a constant exchange of information and experience. Our Instructor Exchange Programme is key to sharing this knowledge and to promoting mutual learning.

The DEU UNTC is committed to continuous quality assurance and improvement and has been a NATO-accredited training institution since 2017. The German United Nations Military Observer Course (DEU UNMOC) is certified by the UN Department of Peace Operations (DPO) and has also been awarded the label “NATO approved”.

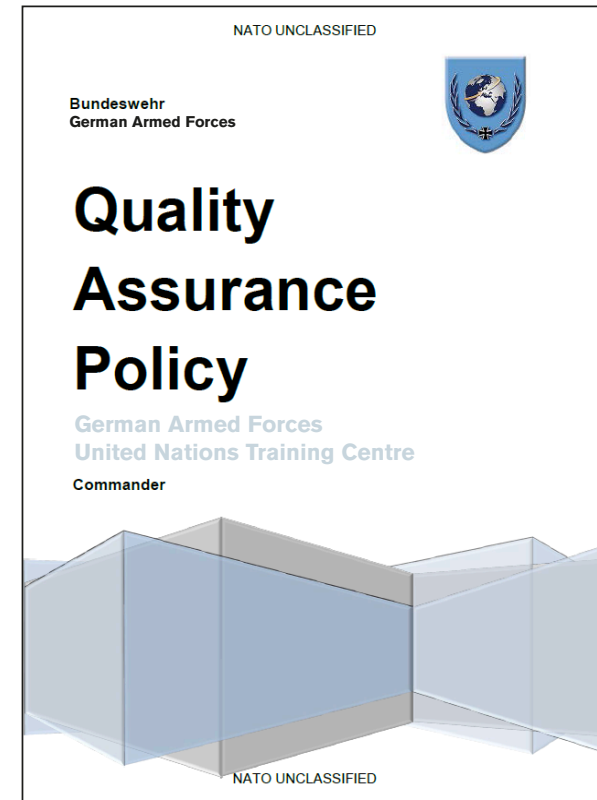

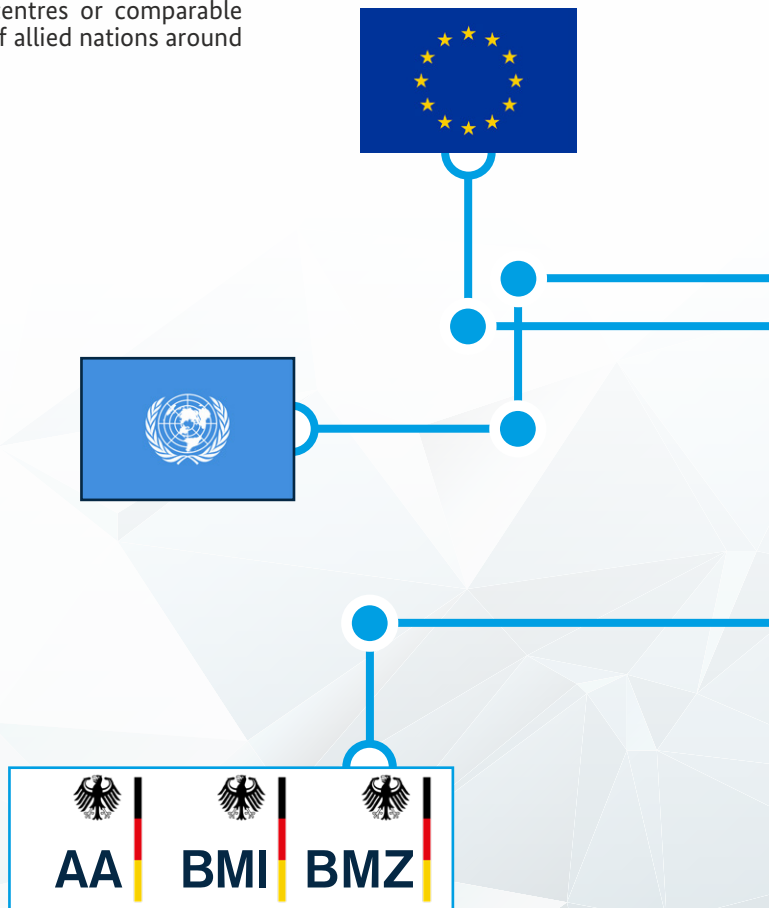


QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

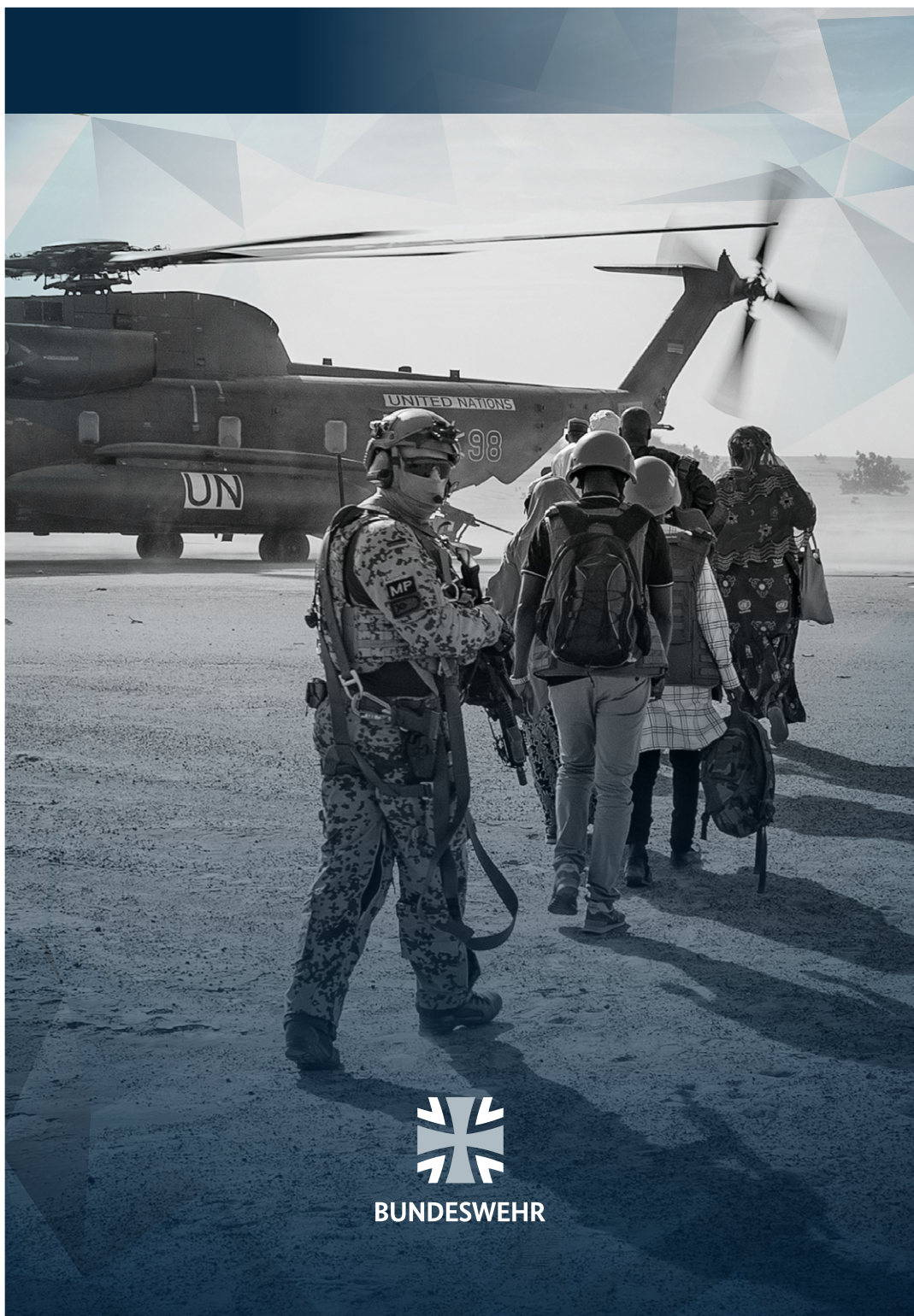
