The JTC provides a JLSG HQ with a training platform for multinational command and control at the operational and tactical levels, and provides support for the further development of doctrine and procedures for the efficient, worldwide deployment of logistic forces.

The Joint Logistic Support Group Coordination and Training Centre (JTC) is a central exercise and training facility with operational materiel and qualified personnel, and has been accredited by NATO since 2019. The experience gained and the constant exchange of information with multinational units enables the JTC to proactively contribute to the shaping and further development of NATO concepts and doctrine. Should it become necessary, the JTC can provide its qualified personnel to augment a Joint Logistic Support Group (JLSG) Headquarters anywhere in the world.

COMMAND POST

The JCTC provides a command post with state-of-the-art command, control, and information systems to enable multinational units to practice logistic support service procedures and workflows in a mission-oriented training environment. The JCTC thus makes a significant contribution to the development of efficient multinational logistic command and control capabilities for operations in the scope of national and collective defence, and also conflict prevention and crisis management.

TRAINING



JCTC training follows a straightforward but effective principle. Building on the logistic experience acquired by our multinational training participants during training at home, JCTC training starts with imparting the fundamentals of NATO logistics. To this end, the JCTC curriculum among other offers includes various opportunities for training on the Logistics Functional Area Services (LOGFAS) logistic command, control and information system and a JLSG HQ orientation course. Since 2019 JCTC is a NATO accredited education and training facility and the courses offered are NATO certified. The courses are followed by workshops/academics or small-scale exercises ("battle staff training") in which this knowledge is consolidated and enhanced. The highlight of the training effort is the exercises involving entire headquarters and including up to 120 participants, e.g. NATO certification exercises for JLSG HQs.
